Seeing your Life through the Lens of the Gospel

Wed Feb 7th - Feast of St Mel, Patron Saint of the Diocese of Ardagh and Clonmacnois - St Mel died in 488. He is said to have been a Briton who came to Ireland with Patrick, with whom he worked until he was ordained in Ardagh. He is one of the earliest Irish saints and gave the religious veil to St Brigid.

Sunday Scriptures

First Reading - Job is wrestling with the problems of why the innocent should suffer. As a result of his own sufferings he takes a rather pessimistic view of life.

Second Reading - St Paul tells how he has made himself all things to all people in order to bring them the Good News of salivation.

Gospel - In the midst of all his activities of teaching and preaching Jesus finds it necessary to escape to a lonely place to pray.

Sunday Reflection - The first reading on each Sunday is usually connected to the gospel of the day. Sometimes an incident occurring in the gospel is seen to be foreshadowed by an earlier event in the Hebrew Scriptures. At other times they will both contain a similar theme. Sometimes the first reading anticipates the gospel theme. However, it is profitable to find out what the first reading meant in it's own day. A second step can then be to see how both reading relate to each other. - St Paul's Sunday Missal
