Sunday Scriptures - First Reading - Jerusalem is urged to rejoice because her salvation is at hand. God himself stands in her midst, the king and the protector of his people. We too should take heart from this message of hope.

Second Reading - This urges us to rejoice in the Lord. To be free of anxiety and to live in a spirit of prayer and thanksgiving.

Gospel - John the Baptist tells various groups of people the works of justice and charity they must do in order to prepare for the ord's coming and to escape his searching judgement

- 1. 'What should we do?' The common thread in John's answers was to encourage his questioners to be other-centered rather than self-centered, each in the context of their own circumstances. In your experience what difference has it made for you when you changed your attitude in this way?
- 2. John told the people in a direct and honest way what they should do. Perhaps you have had friends who did not beat about the bush but told you honestly what they thought about your behaviour when you asked them? In gratitude recall such friends.
- 3. The humility of John comes out in this passage, happy to acknowledge that he only had a minor role to play in relation to the Messiah. At the same time, he was enthused by his mission to 'proclaim the good news to the people'. What difference has it made for you when you were able to see the good in yourself, and use your gifts without having to score by portraying yourself as greater than someone else? - John Byrne OSA (INTERCOM)

Joy is not passive. It is active, current and we have agency to create it ourselves. We don't have to wait for it to tap us on the shoulder. Some practical advice I share is:
