When I was appointed bishop of Ardagh and Clonmacnois by Pope Francis last year, I chose Deus Spes Mea - God is my hope, as my episcopal motto. A motto is defined in the dictionary as a brief statement used to express a goal or ideal. I chose it for a number of reasons, but most especially because it expresses what is at the heart of our Christian faith. Its core message is that God overcomes all obstacles through the fire of hope. We live in a
