## A LITTLE THEOLOGY: REFUGEES

Catholic teaching views immigration not as a divisive phenomenon, but as an occasion to build the human family. It recognises a range of human rights for newcomers, based on their God given dignity that extends far beyond those recognised by individual nations or international bodies. The church holds three key principles while considering this matter: 1. People have a right to migrate to sustain their lives and the lives of their families. 2. Every country has the right to regulate their boarders and the control of immigration, while individuals have the right to move in search of safety, no country is bound to accept all those who wish to resettle there. 3. A country must regulate its borders with both mercy and compassion for all those affected by this reality.

## SAINTLY ADVICE: SIMPLICITY

"Craftiness is the accumulation of artefacts, intrigues, deceits and appearances to mislead the mind of those with whom we converse. This is quiet the reverse of true simplicity which requires that the outside should always correspondence with what is inside. God in his nature is most simple and cannot admit of any duplicity. If we then would be conformed to him we should try to become by virtue what he is by nature. We should be simple in our intention, affections, actions and words." (St. Juilian of Norwich)
