n obedience to the Old Testament law, Mary and Joseph presented L Jesus in the temple forty days after his birth. As poor people they sacrificed 'a pair of turtledoves, or two young pigeons,' rather than a lamb. In its usual succinct way par. 529 of the Catechism of the Catholic Church says, 'The presentation of Jesus in the temple shows him to be the firstborn Son who belongs to the Lord. With Simeon and Anna. all Israel awaits its encounter with the Saviour ... Jesus is recognised as the long-expected Messiah, the "light to the nations" and the "glory of Israel", but also "a sign that is spoken against". The sword of sorrow predicted for Mary announces Christ's perfect and unique oblation on the cross that will impart the salvation God had "prepared in the presence of all peoples".'

Speaking about occasions like the presentation, some writers refer to them as divine appointments and power encounters. It was remarkable that both Simeon and Anna - two devout Jews who had been longing for the promised Messiah for many years - happened, in God's providence, not only to be present in the temple when Jesus was brought there by his parents, but, both of



them were able to go beyond appearances to know, in a prophetic way, the secrets of the heart. Simeon said to Mary, "behold, this child is set for the fall and rising of many in Israel, and for a sign that is spoken against, and a sword will pierce through your own soul also, that thoughts out of many hearts may be revealed." For her part, Anna, an elderly widow, offered prayers and praise to God for Jesus, and spoke to everyone present of his redemptive importance. Clearly, the shadow of the cross had already adumbrated this incident. Just as an oak tree is potentially present in an

acorn, so the future life, death and resurrection of Jesus, the king of the beggars, were implicit in what the two prophets said about him.

When we were infants, our parents presented us to the Lord by bringing us to the church to be baptised. As adults we need to endorse that sense of dedication, while being willing, like Jesus, to renounce our own selfcentred desires in order to remain faithful to the person and will of Jesus just as he remained obedient to the person and will of his Father.
