This year marks the 1,700th anniv of the council of Nicea, held in 325 in what is now present day Turkey, the first ecumenical council, called by the emperor Constaine, to define the tenets of the church and tackle the heresies that were spreading through different false understanding of Christ, the Trinity and salvation. To this day the creed is recited every Sunday at mass, 'the creed'. We recite it not as a formula of ideas, but as an expression of our faith in Jesus, the trinity and our salvation.
