SUNDAY REFLECTION - On the last Sunday of the Liturgical Year, today, we celebrate the feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Universal King. It was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925 at the close of the Jubilee Year. Jesus was questioned at his trial: are you a king? His answer serves to highlight how different his kingship is from that of human rulers.

<u>Sunday Scriptures - First Reading</u> - David had already been anointed king of Judah. Here we read how the northern tribes also acknowledge him as king. Thus David became the king of a united country.

<u>Second Reading</u> - Paul gives thanks to God for having delivered us from the dominion of darkness and transferred us to the Kingdom of his Son, who is not only head of the Church but head of all creation.

<u>Gospel</u> - This tells of the mockery Christ suffered as he hung on the cross, and how in the midst of it he brought hope and salvation to one of the thieves crucified with him.

Dear young people, continue to be signs of hope, the hope that does not disappoint, the hope that is rooted in the love of Christ. To be signs of Christ means to be his witnesses, heralds of the Gospel, precisely around that Sea from whose shores the first disciples set out. For believers, the future is not one of walls and barbed wire, but one of mutual acceptance....Sow seeds of peace wherever seeds of hatred and resentment are springing up. Be patient builders of unity where polarisation and enmity prevail. Be the voice of those who have no voice in calling for justice and respect for human dignity.
