Sunday Scriptures - First Reading

Here we are given a portrait of a true servant of God. He is gentle and humble of heart, and totally dedicated to his mission, which is to bring about true justice.

Second Reading - Here we have a description of how the early Christians saw Baptism. The baptized person was said to have been 'anointed with the Holy Spirit and with power.'

Gospel - This tells of the Baptism of Jesus in the river Jordan by his cousin John, how his true identity was revealed, and how he was given power for the mission he was about to begin.

SUNDAY REFLECTION - Begin by recalling some special moments between yourself and our parents. Did you ever hear from them the equivalent of "This is my son, my daughter, the beloved: my favour rests on you"? In Jesus' ministry, on several occasions, he felt such a word from his Abba, his Father. His baptism by John was one such moment, as was the Transfiguration later on. Such deep love and affirmation grounded him as a human being and as God's prophet to the people of Israel. Our sense of calling grows out of our relationship with the Father, whose beloved we are, whose favour we enjoy.

- **Seeing your Life through the Lens of the Gospel** •
- Jesus, the sinless Son of God, embraces humility and insists on being baptised to 'fulfill all righteousness.' He joins Himself with humanity's need for repentance. Am I too willing to embrace humility. Am I prove to avoiding situations that I think beneath me, or like Christ, am I willing to enter into the struggles of others to serve and fulfill God's purpose?
- Jesus' baptism wasn't about confessing personal sin but about obediently inaugurating His mission. His submission to the Father's plan is the model for our own discipleship. There is a difference between just following rituals and inner obedience to God. Is my faith expressed through active steps of obedience to God's will, even when I don't fully understand it?
- Before Jesus performed any miracles or preached any sermons, the Father affirmed His identity: 'This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.' Our worth as a human being is not rooted in our productivity or success but in being God's beloved child through Christ. Am I living and striving for a love and approval that I already possess by God's grace?
- At Jesus' baptism the Trinity is uniquely revealed, the Son in the water, the Spirit descending, the Father speaking. This illustrated the communal nature of God. My faith invites me into this divine relationship. As I reflect on the quality of my connection with God, I ask myself is it a distant transaction, or an intimate, relational communion with the Father, through the Son, in the power of the Spirit? - INTERCOM
