Sunday Scriptures - First Reading - The prophet predicts future glory for an oppressed people: light will replace darkness; joy will replace sorrow and freedom will replace oppression.

Second Reading - This shows that even among the first Christians there were divisions. But Paul urges unity in Christ.

Gospel - That wonderful prophecy of Isaiah is seen as being fulfilled in Christ.

SUNDAY REFLECTION - The Heart of Jesus' proclamation is given in today's Gospel. As is often noted, the word "repent" is not the best translation of the original Greek and it would be better to use some other expression such as "convert." It really means a new way of looking at everything, a new mind or outlook. It may of course include being sorry about the past, but the real energy is towards the future: "convert and put your trust in the Good News." We could put it like this: from what are we called to conversion is important; more important is towards what are we being called?

'Repent', in other words, 'Change our life'. Today Jesus speaks those same words to you: 'Take heart, I am here with you, allow me to enter and your life will change'. Jesus knocks at the door. That is why the Lord gives you his word, so that you can receive it like a love letter he has written to you, to help you realise that he is at your side. His word consoles and encourages us. At the same time it challenges us, frees us from the bondage of our selfishness and summons us to conversion. Because his word has the power to change our lives and to lead us out of darkness into the light.

Food for thought:

The 1960's saw the struggle for equality for people of colour. Led by Martin Luther King a great non-violent movement for equality set the following principles for members:

1. Meditate daily on the teachings of Jesus.
2. Remember always that the non-violence movement seeks justice and reconciliation - not victory.
3. Walk and talk in the manner of love, for God is love.
4. Pray daily to be used by God in order that all people might be free.
5. Sacrifice personal wishes in order that all people might be free.
6. Observe with both friend and foe the ordinary rules of courtesy.
7. Seek to perform regular service for others and for the world.
8. Refrain from the violence of fist, tongue or heart.
9. Strive to be in good spiritual and bodily health.

These are honourable principles which could inspire us all on our life's journey.
